Hello Comrades,

As know, we have been doing well in supporting our local veterans by having our office open 4 days a week in the mornings of Monday through Thursday. we just attended the DAV National Convention in Orlando. From the standpoint of a service officer, it was very beneficial to me to have a better understanding of the Compensation and Pension (C&P) rules the VA and their contractors are required to go by. New information to us is that they are not allowed to take in consideration additional information that they Veteran takes with him/her to the C&P exam. The VA wants ALL of the evidence turned in with the original claim. Once the Examiner receives the order from the VA, they have 3 weeks to examine the Veteran and report back thier findings in accordance with the 38 CFR.

Greetings Comrades, I am writing this as your 2nd District Junior Vice Commander, representing the 4th District and Chapter 9 Senior Vice Commander. I'm sure most of you have heard about the PACT Act. The PACT Act is a new law that expands VA healthcare and benefits for Veterans exposed to burn pits and other toxic substances. This law helps us provide generations of Veterans and their survivors with the care and benefits they've earned and deserve.

The Pact Act will bring these changes:

* Expands and extends eligibility for VA health care for Veterans of the Vietnam, Gulf War, and post 9/11 war eras.

* Adds more than 20 new presumptive conditions for burns pits and other toxic exposures.

* Adds more presumptive-exposure locations for agent orange and radiation.

* Requires the VA to provide a toxic exposure screening to every Veteran enrolled in VA healthcare.

* Helps to improve research, staff education, and treatment, related to toxic exposures.

If you're a Veteran or survivor, you can file claims ow to apply for PACT Act-related benefits. For more info go to: va.gov/PACT. It's encouraging to start sending in your claims for these diseases immediately, even though the VA will not start processing these claims until January 2023.

The Department of Alabama DAV will be holding the annual Commander's and Adjutant's Training on September 10th in Alexander City, Alabama. This training is also open to anyone who would like to attend. The Department holds townhall meetings monthly, so if anyone is interested in this or has any suggestions for our training, please let me know.

The DAV National Commander at the National Convention in Orlando reported that the DAV Transportation Network for the past year conducted 160,000 rides taking Veterans to their VA appointments. Volunteer drivers logged more than half a million hours while driving over 8 million miles! DAV's fleet of vehicles stood ready to help make the healthcare that Veterans have earned more easily accessible.

Since the transportation network begain in 1987 DAV has donated over 3,600 vehicles while the oldest corporate partner, Ford Motor Company, has donated over 250 vehicles. As a reminder, we are always looking out for new volunteer drivers!

VA Update

The 2023 VA disability rates will be officially released on October 13, 2022, with the implementation of the Social Security Administration's (SSA) 2023 Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) increase, which could be as high as 8.9%. The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) adjusts VA disability compensation rates each year based on the SSA's annual COLA increase. The final VA disability rates 2023 will be based on the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) report of September 2022 inflation data.

What's the bottom line?

Veterans could see a gigantic 8.9% COLA increase this year due to rising inflation in the economy caused by increasing consumer demand and decreasing supply (supply chain shortages), which has led to a significant increase in the cost of consumer goods and services.

Yes, disabled veterans with a 10% VA rating or higher will see an estimated 8.9% COLA increase on their monthly VA compensation payment beginning January 2023.

An 8.9% COLA increase to VA disability rates in 2023 would be the largest boost in 40 years.

COST-OF-LIVING ADJUSTMENTS (COLAs)

COLAs are based on increases in the Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W).

They are calculated by comparing the average CPI-W for the third quarter of the year in which the most recent COLA became effective to the average CPI-W for the third quarter of the current year.
