6. UNFINISHED/OLD BUSINESS:

- a. Establish Audit Committee
 - 1. Hentz, McKenna and B. Johnson are assigned to the Audit Committee. Our Annual Financial Report due, September 30, 2019 was approved, signed and submitted.
- b. Check presentation for Believet
 - Believet was established in 2015 due to Sam Daly, a civilian contractor with the U.S. Marine Corps during deployments to Afghanistan, understanding the unmet need of injured veterans returning from war and how service dogs were a positive solution to assisting with multiple war related symptoms. Charles Kenow noted Believet serves all vets. It takes \$20,000 to train 1 dog with about 18 months of training. A veteran works with their dog for 120 hours too in addition to the previous training. 86% of funds were used for costs to train the animals. Currently they have multiple dogs in training and are working on placement with

other veterans. David DuChene, a Vietnam Veteran, spoke how having a service dog from Believet has been a life saver for him.

- c. Check presentation for Project Delta Inc.
 - Project Delta was started as a passion project due to seeing and knowing from personal experience with family members what soldiers go through while serving in the military. Patti Wherritt-Robinson stated what makes Project Delta special is the use of dogs from shelters or rescues that are often overlooked or forgotten to be paired up with a veteran. Once there is a match with the veteran and dog, they both work and train together as a team. It is about a 9-month process but there is ongoing training and mandatory recertification for the service dog team. Currently there is utilization of Your Dogs Best Friend (https://www.ydbf.org/) for training, bonding and CGC (Canine Good Citizen) certification. Obtaining the CGC certificate takes 120 hours of public access training. These dogs assist the veterans to transition from needing to go place to wanting to go places. Currently 2 veterans have entered into the workforce along with taking their service animals with them.

7. NEW BUSINESS & GENERAL INFORMATION:

- a. DAV MN Fall Conference October 3-5 Minneapolis, MN
 - Members who will be attending CSO training for Thursday the 3rd of October will be Campero, Carlson, Jaruszewski and Turbett
 - Members who will be attending the conference on the 4th through the 5th of October will be Campero, Carlson, Hamann, Hunt, Jaruszewski, Schilling, Tessmer, and Turbett.
 - Registration fees have been paid and it is expected the named members be in attendance at the conference.
- b. Fall Fundraising: Forget Me Nots
 - 1. October 12, 19 and 26th
 - These are the dates approved by the Department to fall in line with the national bylaws to only raise funds for 7 days in a fiscal year (1 July 30 June) for the Forget Me Not Program and the Chapter has approval to add additional locations only on these specified dates. This topic will be discussed at the 2019 MN DAV Fall Conference. The Chapter will work on a motion to modify the

bylaws to include "with the consent of the state department" back into the national bylaws. The Chapter's additional days have always been approved in the past even though it was above the 7-day limit. This current fiscal year the Chapter was denied additional days for fundraising.

- c. Omni Brewing fundraising Saturday November 9th, 2019 (weekend before Veterans Day)
- d. Golden corral fundraising weekend before Veterans Day (Nationwide fundraiser and does not count towards 7 days annually)
- e. Applebee's fundraising at both locations on Veterans Day, Monday November 11th (if "forget me not" counts this location as one of our 7 allowed dates per membership) Verification for reservation at these locations will be known on Tuesday October 8th to submit for approval.
- f. VAMC Visitation September 22, 2019: Schilling
 - 4th Sunday of the month. C. Harold was unable to participate but did put the bags together. \$5 script was put in the bags and it went over much better than the \$1 script. \$260 was approximately used. Funding for the script is from a \$1,500 grant from DAV MN Headquarters. Approximately \$550 has been used from the \$1,500. We are still planning on using \$10 bills for Christmas time.
- g. VAMC request to purchase \$300 in script was approved in the Chapter Board Meeting

- h. Request for approval for funding for an individual to pay for additional costs occurred for transporting deceased military members ashes from Minnesota to Utah.
 - Sister applied for a request through MN DAV NSO for \$1,000 to assist to pay for costs and \$300 was paid by the VA. Remaining total needing to be paid is \$1318.00. We are asking for approval for \$1,000.

Motion to approve by, Kelley seconded by Hentz, carried.

• There were opposing members but approval outweighed the decision. No role call requested by Chapter members so approval to pay \$1,000 passed.

 Members do want to annotate there needs to be more mindfulness when NSO's bring requests for funding to particular chapters to honor city boundaries.
