The MN Department has again helped us by renewing the Membership Plan of \$100 for Life Membership for the Veteran, the Chapter giving \$100 and the Department giving \$100. Summer is over, as a Chapter we are back to a more normal monthly schedule of meetings. Many of us are still being exposed to and becoming ill with COVID-19, but as a society we are moving toward to our new normal. One of the most significant national legislative actions in veterans health was passed in Aug 2022. See later in this newsletter for more details regarding the PACT ACT.

The state of Minnesota created a Post 9/11 veteran bonus program this year. Those who served post 9/11 may receive a bonus between \$600 to \$1200 (\$2,000 for Gold Star Families). The basic criteria are being a Minnesota resident when entering active duty service, currently being a Minnesota resident and have documentation of your service, e.g DD214. The eligible period of service is 9-11-2001 thru 8-30-2021. Applications for the bonus payment opened up this past July 7, 2022 and remain open until June 30, 2024. DAV, along with other Veteran Service Organizations, actively fought for the passage of the PACT ACT. The PACT ACT is the Sergeant First Class Heath Robinson Honoring Our Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxins Act of 2022. This is a bill that directly addresses the impact on Veterans and others who were exposed to environmental toxins, burn pits, radiation, and Agent Orange due to their time in service. The veteran's PACT Act of 2022 is a law designed to care for veterans exposed to toxic substances during their military service. The law provides expanded health care and disability benefits for veterans and their families. It will be phased into practice from the effective date (August 10, 2022) to October 2026.

The VA PACT Act has three main functions:

- Expanded VA health care eligibility and disability benefits to veterans and Families exposed to toxic substances. The law reforms the VA's presumptive decision- making process and addresses three main types of toxic exposure: burn pits, Agent Orange, and radiation.
- Reforms the VA's process for adding and removing presumptive conditions to the VA's list. This includes giving a timeline of 160 days to the Secretary of the VA to begin to add a condition to the list after receiving a recommendation.
- Increases resources to the VA to bolster VA claims processing, the VA's workforce, and VA health care facilities to make sure the VA can take on the added responsibility of caring for veterans with toxic exposure.

Many of our members were exposed to toxic substances during their careers. Our DAV National Service Officers are an excellence resource in answering your questions regarding filing a claim (or supplemental claim). One of the benefits of attending our monthly Chapter Meeting is meeting two of the National Service Officers.
