



BENEFITS FOR VETERANS WITH 100% Scheduler or IU (Individual Unemployability)

If You: Have 100% (Scheduler or IU)	You Are Eligible For:
COMMISSARY AND EXCHANGE PRIVILEGES, BASE ACCESS AND MWR (MORALE, WELFARE AND RECREATION)	Honorably discharged veterans with 100 percent service-connected disability, and their dependents and un-remarried surviving spouses, are entitled to unlimited exchange and commissary store privileges, as well as general base access and MWR facilities and programs.
DENTAL TREATMENT	Veterans who have a total, service-connected disability may be entitled to free dental treatment. Contact your VAMC Dental department. You may be required to first go to the VAMC Eligibility office for verification.
SOCIAL SECURITY BENEFITS	The Social Security Administration (SSA) administers several benefit programs, including Social Security retirement and disability benefits and Medicare. https://www.ssa.gov/people/veterans/
D-S-DVI (RH) LIFE INSURANCE (\$10,000 PAID BY THE VA). THIS INCLUDES AN EXISTING POLICY AND FOR NEW POLICIES THE VETERAN MUST BE UNDER 65 YEARS OF AGE.	Veterans who have the basic S-DVI coverage and are totally disabled are eligible to have their premiums waived for up to \$10,000. If a premium waiver is granted, policyholders may apply for additional coverage of up to \$30,000 under the Supplemental S-DVI program.
STATE BENEFITS FOR TOTALLY DISABLED VETERANS VARY STATE BY STATE.	Check with your individual state DVA. Check your state's Veterans Affairs website for further information. Some examples may include Property Tax exemption and free Licensing.

BENEFITS FOR VETERANS WITH PERMANENT & TOTAL STATUS (P&T) *IN ADDITION TO THE ABOVE*

If You: Have Permanent & Total status (P&T)	You Are Eligible For:
DEPENDENTS' EDUCATIONAL ASSISTANCE (DEA)	Generally, the veteran's spouse and the veteran's children between 18 and 26 years old are entitled to DEA. DEA is also payable to the surviving spouse and children of a veteran who died as a result of service-connected disability or had a permanent and total service-connected disability at the time of death. CIVILIAN HEALTH AND MEDICAL PROGRAM OF THE DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS (CHAMPVA).	CHAMPVA provides medical care coverage for the spouse or child of a veteran who has permanent and total service-connected disability, if the spouse or child does not have entitlement to care under the Department of Defense's TRICARE Program. <p>CHAMPVA In-house Treatment Initiative (CITI)</p>	<p>CITI is a voluntary program that allows treatment of beneficiaries of the Civilian Health and Medical Program of the Department of Veteran Affairs (CHAMPVA) at Veterans Affairs medical centers (VAMCs) that have elected to participate in CITI.</p>
<p>VA Dental Insurance Program (VADIP)</p>	<p>VA’s comprehensive VA Dental Insurance Program (VADIP) gives all VA healthcare enrolled Veterans and CHAMPVA beneficiaries the opportunity to purchase dental insurance through Delta Dental and MetLife at a reduced cost. Participation is voluntary. Purchasing a dental plan does not affect Veterans’ eligibility for VA dental services and treatment. https://www.va.gov/healthBenefits/vadip/</p>
<p>JOB COUNSELING AND EMPLOYMENT SERVICES</p>	<p>A job and job training counseling service program, employment placement service program, and job training placement service program are available to a spouse of any veteran who has a permanent and total service-connected disability or had a permanent and total service-connected disability at the time of death.</p>
<p>AUTOMOBILE AND ADAPTIVE EQUIPMENT BENEFITS</p>	<p>Veterans who have a permanent and total service-connected disability due to</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> >loss or permanent loss of use of one or both hands, or >loss or permanent loss of use of one or both feet, or >permanent impairment of vision in both eyes with a central visual acuity of 20/200 or less in the better eye with corrective glasses, or central visual acuity of more than 20/200 if there is a field defect in which the peripheral field has contracted to such an extent that the widest diameter of visual field has an angular distance no greater than 20 degrees in the better eye <p>may be entitled to financial assistance in purchasing a conveyance and adaptive equipment for automobiles and similar vehicles. http://www.benefits.va.gov/compensation/claims-special-auto-allowance.asp</p>
<p>SPECIAL HOME ADAPTATION GRANT</p>	<p>Veterans who have a permanent and total service-connected disability due to blindness in both eyes with 5/200 visual acuity or less, or the loss or loss of use of both hands may be entitled to a VA grant of not more than \$10,000 to pay the cost of remodeling a house in which they reside. <p>SPECIALLY ADAPTED HOUSING</p>	<p>Veterans who have a permanent and total service-connected disability due to the loss or loss of use of both lower extremities, which prevents locomotion without the aid of braces, crutches, canes, or a wheelchair, or blindness in both eyes, having light perception only, combined with the loss or loss of use of one lower extremity, or the loss or loss of use of one lower extremity, together with residuals of organic disease or injury or the loss or loss of use of one upper extremity, which so affect the functions of balance or propulsion as to prevent locomotion without the aid of braces, crutches, canes, or a wheelchair, or loss or loss of use of both upper extremities, which prevents use of the arms at or above the elbows may be entitled to a VA grant of not more than 50 percent, or up to a maximum of \$50,000, to pay part of the cost of building, buying or remodeling a specially adapted house or to pay indebtedness on such a home already acquired.</p> <p>http://www.benefits.va.gov/homeloans/adaptedhousing.asp</p>
