

Victor Griguoli, 70, died Monday, July 11, 2016, at Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital - Somerset, Somerville. He was a baseball and basketball umpire for local teams. He was an avid bowler, holding several trophies. He was also an avid fisherman and woodworker, and enjoyed horseracing.
