Legislative Happenings 0.3% COLA Approved for 2017

Injured and ill veterans, their dependents and survivors in receipt of VA compensation benefits will receive a 0.3% Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) increase beginning January 1, 2017.

On July 22, 2016, H.R. 5588, the Veterans' Compensation COLA Act of 2016, was signed into law by the President and became Public Law 114-197. The bill did not contain the contested round-down provision, which would have resulted in compensation rates being rounded down to the nearest whole dollar. Instead, VA compensation beneficiaries will receive their full COLA.

On October 19, 2016, the Social Security Administration announced that Social Security beneficiaries would receive a 0.3% COLA increase. Because veterans COLAs are tied to Social Security adjustments, veterans compensation rates will increase by 0.3% effective December 2016 and will be realized in compensation payments beginning January 1, 2017.

DAV appreciates the COLA increase for 2017, but we will continue to press Congress for COLA increases that better reflect and keep pace with increased living expenses and are in line with the hardships and unique circumstances of our nation's injured and ill veterans, their dependents and survivors. VA to Offer Routine Eye and Ear Appointments Without Primary Care Referral

Veterans receiving care at VA Medical Centers will now be able to schedule routine ear and eye appointments at local VA Audiology and Optometry clinics without a primary care referral. Before now, veterans seeking appointments with audiologists or optometrists had to first make an appointment with a primary care physician for a referral for a routine clinic consult visit. A clinic representative would contact the patient to set up the consult appointment, which could result in a several weeks'-long lag between the appointment and when the veteran was actually seen.

The Audiology and Optometry Direct Scheduling Initiative, which began as a successful pilot in 2015, is expected to be fully operational at all VA Medical Centers by the end of 2016.



2LT ELIZABETH ANN JONES





2LT Elizabeth A. Jones was one of the first military women killed in the Vietnam War and, thankfully, the only female KIA from South Carolina. She was assigned to the 51st Field

Hospital in Saigon. 2LT Jones died when her 'Huey' helicopter had a wire strike over a river. Elizabeth was born in 1943 and raised in Allendale, SC; was a 1964 graduate in nursing of the Medical College of South Carolina at Charleston, and was assigned to the US Army Hospital, Fort Jackson, SC, before her service in Vietnam. She was engaged to be married to the pilot of the Huey, LTC Charles M. Honour, Jr.
