Leadership Greer Project

Every year Greer's Leadership Class chooses an annual project to help the citizens of Greer. This year's class has devoted our efforts toward assisting the Disabled American Veterans (DAV), Greer Chapter 39 by providing a mobile booth (open trailer) to be used to display and provide information to recruit new members and to provide resources to veterans and their families, including how to file claims with the Veterans Administration. The mobile booth will be used at various local City of Greer events, with the unveiling planned for the **2012 Village Hospital Greer Family Fest on May 4th and 5th**. Able members will continue to volunteer at the event as they have in the past. The upfit of the mobile booth will be provided by the DAV through a local patron.

In addition to providing the mobile booth, at an estimated cost of **\$5,000 to \$7,000** the Leadership Greer Class is looking to raise another **\$5,000 to \$10,000** as scholarships for Camp Corral, a summer camp for children of wounded or disabled military families. To continue to honor those who served our country, Golden Corral has created a summer camp for children of wounded or disabled military families. Camp Corral provides a fun and developmental experience that will help to improve the often challenging lives of those children who live with wounded or disabled military families. An experience at Camp Corral is a memory that will last a lifetime. Kids have a chance to create friendships and bond with other kids who share in the same unique situation of having a wounded or disabled parent. Disabled American Veterans

Since its founding more than 80 years ago, the Disabled American Veterans (DAV) has been dedicated to building better lives for America's disabled veterans and their families. Whether disabled veterans have needed a voice on Capitol Hill, a nationwide service program, a transportation network or unique rehabilitation opportunities, DAV has focused its attention and resources to meet those needs.

Any man or woman, who was wounded, gassed, injured or disabled in the line of duty during time of war, while in the service of either the military or naval forces of the United States of America, and who has not been dishonorably discharged or separated from such service, or who may still be in active service in the armed forces of the United States of America is eligible for membership in the Disabled American Veterans. Others who are disabled while serving with any of the armed forces of any nations associated with the United States of America as allies during any of its war periods, who are American citizens and who are honorably discharged, are also eligible.

Founded in 1920, the DAV is totally funded by dues and contributions, receiving no federal funding.

With National Headquarters in Cincinnati and Legislative Headquarters in Washington D.C. and the Department of South Carolina's Headquarters in West Columbia, the DAV focuses strictly on serving veterans and their families. A nonpolitical organization, it has no political action committees (PACS) and endorses no political candidates.

DAV Service Officers are all accredited through the Department of Veterans Affairs and are service-connected disabled veterans themselves, so they understand the issues veterans face. For no charge, DAV Service Officers offer counseling on VA compensation, health care, pension, employment rights, education and they help veterans assemble evidence to support benefit claims, building cases, and preparing claim forms and briefs.

In addition, the DAV extends disaster relief to disabled veterans affected by natural disasters like earthquakes or floods and the Department's Transportation Network transports sick and disabled veterans to VA medical facilities for treatment in South Carolina.

Through a variety of local programs, the DAV reaches into their communities, seeking new ways to help disabled veterans and their families.
