BPT / LEGISLATIVE REPORT

The District IV Meeting has concluded with good attendance. I hope the other District Meetings also were well attended. Since Texas is such a large state and since not all Chapters have the resources to send Delegates to Department or National, the District Meetings offer the opportunity for an interchange of ideas that is vital to our organization. Hopefully many of you will make it to the Department Convention in a few weeks to continue the exchange of ideas that is so important to assure the continuing of services to Disabled Veterans.

The "Hot" news is the budget battle in Washington. Unfortunately this battle has become a contest between political parties not an exchange of ideas about the direction of this Country. What is even more unfortunate is that many of our veteran comrades have been drawn in to rhetoric rather than evaluating ideas and proposals. Examples:

- 1. Medicaid \$ 8 out of every \$ 10 in Medicaid goes to care for seniors in Nursing Homes –this Includes veterans in Nursing Homes. The Nursing Home industry is business, so what happens if a senior cannot pay for care?
- 2. Veterans Benefits, Health and Compensation, are entitlement Programs what happens to our compensation and health care if "Entitlements" are reduced?
- 3. Medicare Vouchers to reduce Medicare Costs sounds good let people choose where to get care. What happens when the dollar value of your voucher runs out sounds like "Stealth" death panels to me. Also, since Medicare is the big bear, if you can voucher to cut costs what happens to little bear (the VA Health Care System)? Do veterans also get the "Stealth" death panels? We need to watch all proposals that relate to savings to make sure we do not support the knife that cuts our throat. Remember, "We love our veterans" and "we thank you for your service" are like a Purple Heart That Plus a \$ 1.50 may buy you a cup of coffee at Starbucks.

I do not suggest we should not request the things that will assist in improving the lives of our Disabled Veteran Comrades and their Families. What I am saying is, don't forget to "hold on to what you got". Speeches are fine but they don't pay the bills. State of Texas –

ALL Field Staff of the Texas Veterans Land Board are Laid Off as of 6/30/2011 – Learn Facebook, TWEET or TWITTER

Texas Veterans Commission will Lose 20 of the 100 Veterans Staff assigned to help Veterans File Claims. The State Comptroller has Violated State and Federal Privacy Laws on Security for Personal information and now the State must pay for Credit Monitoring of all those accounts that were compromised (several million). Way to go for cost savings Ms. Combs.

If you care about your Veteran Comrades write your Congressional Representative (or Face Book, Tweet and Twitter them) If you care about the future of Veterans Benefit Programs RECRUIT New Members – Numbers Count WE are all in the same Boat – START BAILING – Speak up at local Meetings, Speak to Local Congressional Staff. Do not accept "I Love and Respect you" as acceptable payback for your sacrifice.

Remember – If we do NOT ACT NOW we will look at OUR Current Veteran Benefits as "the good old days".

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER


