
At the Sub-Executive Committee meeting held on June 11, Department Commander Darla Sanders asked about what our focus should be on for the next few years.

Greetings!

Congratulations to everyone for another successful State Convention. I would like to announce that for this next year of service to our veterans and their families, we have Sharon Bilodeau as our Sr. Vice Commander and Lacey Hanner Bankston as our Jr. Vice Commander.

I am pleased to report that prior to my attending the DAV/Auxiliary State Convention in Ogden, Utah the donations earmarked for the Veterans Community Living Center at Rifle, and the Grand Junction VA Medical Center were delivered. The Veterans Community Living Center at Rifle will use their donation to purchase a 55" T.V. for the community room and any funds available after that purchase, will to go toward small television sets for individual veteran's rooms. The donation to the Grand Junction VA Medical Center will be used to assist homeless veterans with transportation to and from appointments at the medical center, and to purchase a "fixed" coffee station. A fixed coffee station will be safer and more accessible with a direct connection to a main water supply.



After a five-day rest, it was off to Albuquerque, New Mexico for their State Convention. It is worth noting that Past National Commander, Donna Adams, the National Representative for Utah's convention and National Sr. Vice Commander, Diane Frantz, National Representative for New Mexico's convention, both conducted a mini school of instruction. This is noteworthy since Utah and New Mexico have newly formed Auxiliary units, which made the information that they received very helpful and much appreciated. There are many members, who for various reasons, are unable to attend the annual Fall Conference where they would have exposure to that school of instruction, so having them at state conventions, can go a long way in bridging that instructional gap. I am grateful that I was able to experience the excitement of these two new units.

One thing really stood out at the New Mexico convention was the number of male Auxiliary members, and the large number of young adults in attendance. They were present, vocal and participatory in all levels of the convention. It was quite special to hear one of the young women from New Mexico identify who she sees as her personal mentor. It was obvious that the more seasoned member also took pride in her role as a mentor. So...just a reminder that we must each determine that we will be open and available to mentor new members and to receiving mentoring from our senior, more tenured members.

National Convention is quickly approaching so be sure to solidify travel plans and lodging accommodations as soon as possible. Hotel reservations filled up so quickly this year so that means the real possibility of needing to use an overflow/sister hotel. Although I will not be able to attend National Convention this year, our State Sr. Vice Commander, Sharon Bilodeau will be present, and I remain excited about every opportunity that allows me to be of service to our veterans and their families, and to support our DAV/Auxiliary family.
