National Service Office

VA has announced a new initiative called the Decision Ready Claim. This initiative applies to Disability Increase Claims and DIC claims only. You MUST submit through a Veteran Service Organization (such as DAV). Because of the method of submission, VA will not accept this application through e-benefits or through any method of submission other than through your VSO. This process can NOT be used to submit a new claim for service connection or secondary service connection. You must submit all supporting medical evidence and exams at the time of filing. Once VA accepts the claim, a decision will be rendered within 30 days. Contact your local CSO, DSO or the Portland NSO office.
